During hands-on portions for the class trainees worked on various outboard engines that were available, but were also encouraged to bring their own engines into the shop. The training lasted for three weekends. All states sending trainees who successfully completed the course will recieve a mechanic's tool kit that will allow their rangers to use their newly developed skills to keep their boat engines running propperly

Water operators from outlying states of Palau also have been attending training to review and sharpen their skill at troubleshooting the electrical systems of their water treatment plants. This has meant becoming familiar with the electrical control panels for their pump stations—how they work, how they are wired, and what are their components. They also learned how to use an electrical tester. The goal of the training was to learn how to identify defects in the electrical system when a pump is not working, so that experts can make proper adjustments or repairs to the system. So far, two classes have been held covering this training topic, and one more is planned for the summer, in order that all the outlying states' water operators

HIV AND TB Presentations on Tuesday Night

A Tuesday Night Program for dorm residents and interested students was held on April 30, 2013 at Cafeteria. GF-HIV Project Coordinator, Evita Ngirmeriil was the guest speaker for the evening. The topic for the night focused on HIV/AIDS & STI, and Tuberculosis (TB). Ms. Ngirmeriil emphasized how HIV/AIDS & STI are transmitted and discussed different stages of HIV infections. She also reiterated prevention methods to protect oneself and their partner through sexual activity. Ms. Ngirmeriil further discussed two types of Sexually Transmitted Infection (STI) and common symptoms associated with them and how to protect yourself. In her last presentation of the night, she discussed how Tuberculosis is transmitted, signs and symptoms, and drug treatment including course of treatment and its duration. The Tuesday Night Program are an effort of the Student Life Office to provide informations and activities to the dorm residents to promote healthy living and lifestyle. CRE RESEARCHER PRESENTS IN INDIA

On April 10-16, 2013, PCC-CRE's Aquaculture Researcher, Mr. Miguel Delos Santos travelled to India to attend an International Seminar-Workshop on Mud Crab Aquaculture and Fisheries Management (ISMAF 2013) that was organized by the Ragiv Gandhi Centre for Aquaculture (RGCA) in Tamil Nadu, India and the Philippine based Southeast Asian Fisheries Development Center, Aquaculture Department (SEAFDEC/ AQD). The purpose of meeting was to bring together the mud crab scientists, industry practitioners/

stakeholders and the academe from various parts of the globe to discuss the present status of the industry, share insights of the relevant issues and identify the problem areas for further research and development on mud crab aquaculture and fisheries management for a sustainable mud crab also known as mangrove crab aquaculture industry. During the meeting, Mr. Delos Santos was able to share one of his research works on mangrove crab in Palau through a poster presentation entitled "The Effect of Tank Colors on the Survival Rate of Mudcrab Scylla serrata" Larvae. Country papers on the current aquaculture and fishery management practices in the Indo-Pacific region were presented by their respective country representatives, followed a visit to the RGCA Mud Crab Hatchery and Grow-out Demonstration Farms was also conducted. to provide the scientists and researchers the directions for their future research activities on mud crab. Three separate workshop sessions were held to tackle the issues on Biology/Hatchery, Grow-out/Soft Shell Farming and Fisheries Management. It was also during the meeting that the international participants agreed to change the name of "mudcrab" to "mangrove crab" as common name for the portunid crab under the genus Scylla.
