# PCC Students Tour the New Aimeliik Power Plant

On Wednesday, April 23, 2014 the Electrical Technology (ET) students along with their instructor attended the opening ceremony of the new Aimeliik Power Plant. The new power plant of two 5MW (mega-watts) generators is capable of generating 10MW of power. Combined with the generators of the Malakal Power Plant, Palau Public Utilities Corporation (PPUC) now provides a maximum generating capacity of 27MW. The power plant is a replacement of the old IPSECO Plant that was destroyed by a fire in November 2011.

The entire rebuilding project cost \$22 million and was funded by the Overseas Development Assistance from the government of Japan. It included the purchase and installation of two 5MW generators, installation of operators, and training that prepared operators to run the power plant on a daily (24/7) basis. Twelve employees successfully completed the training and were awarded certificates.

Following the ceremony, a Plant Engineer took the PCC students on a guided tour of the plant. Power Plant, continued on page 3

#### Dr. Douglas S. Farrer Visits PCC

He has also written a book entitled *Shadows of the Prophet: Martial Arts and Sufi Mysticism* (2009) which explored the Malay martial art and silat.

Dr. Farrer received his PhD in Anthropology from the National University of Singapore.

# The Hamburg Ethnological Museum

A presentation was held at the Palau Community College (PCC) Assembly Hall on Tuesday, April 15, 2014 about the Hamburg Ethnological Museum. Dr. Wulf Köpke, the Executive Director of the museum, spent an afternoon providing information about the museum and its collections to interested members of the community. Included in the presentation was information about the many cultural and traditional artifacts collected by Germans during Germany's Administration of Palau and the Pacific region.

During the German Administration of the Pacific islands, a South Sea Expedition was organized by the Hamburg Museum. Involved in the expedition was a German Ethnologist Augustin Krämer and his wife Elisabeth Krämer-Bannow. The couple had spent years in Palau learning the native language and interacting with the local people in order to construct accurate documentations about the island's traditions and culture. As a result, Dr. Krämer and his wife wrote five volumes about Palau that became part of the ethnological book series entitled Ergebnisse der Südsee-Expedition (1908-1910). Today, a project being funded by the German government is in the process of translating the volumes so that the rich information collected over a hundred years ago may be shared with Palau's modern generation.

The Ethnological Museum is located in Hamburg, Germany. Founded in 1879, the museum holds a large collection of cultural history from all over the world including the islands in the Pacific Ocean.
