Pacific Partnership 2016 at PCC Palau Community College (PCC) is currently the host site for the medical, dental, and eye services being offered through the 2016 Pacific Partnership. From Friday, August 05, 2016 to Saturday, August 13, 2016 military service members from Japan, Australia, the United Kingdom, and the United States will conduct cooperative health engagements for the community of Palau. The service members will also participate in expert exchanges with the medical and civil-engineering teams in Palau in order to improve the island's collective ability to respond to a variety of natural disasters. The medical services being offered are free to all community members. Those interested in taking advantage of the free medical services may visit the college for further assistance. Initiated in 2007, the Pacific Partnership is a multi-national goodwill mission that promotes visits to countries in the Pacific region in order to provide medical care, civil-engineering support, and cultural exchanges.

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

The meeting opened with a prayer from Financial Aid Counselor Sione Fakatou. He was followed by the welcoming remarks of the Classified Staff Organization (CSO) President/PCC Registrar Lesley Adachi. CSO President Adachi encouraged teamwork among the college personnel with the aim of providing quality service to the students.

PCC President Dr. Patrick U. Tellei followed with a presentation about the college. A brief history introduced the beginnings of the college as a vocational training institution and the changes that made it into Palau's only institution of higher learning. His presentation included an overview of the college departments, services, personnel data, and financial status.

PCC Accreditation Liaison Officer (ALO) shared an update about the current accreditation status of the college. She focused on the evaluation report that was compiled by the accreditation team that visited this year. The report highlighted the positive aspects of the college and offered comments/recommendations that will help the institution meet the accreditation standards in order to achieve quality improvements.

PCC Institutional Research Analyst Ligaya Sara followed with an overview of the Institutional-Set Standards for Student Achievement (ISSA) and supporting data, such as enrollment & graduation student numbers. The convocation ended with remarks from the Faculty Senate Association (FSA) President Johvanna Yaoch.
