Board of Trustees Annual Organizational Meeting

Pursuant to Republic of Palau Public Law RPPL4-2, the Board of Trustees of Palau Community College held its Annual Organizational meeting on Monday, January 9th (2nd Mon. of Jan.) to elect its officers and establish its calendar of regular meetings. At the meeting the Board voted to retain the same officers for 2017. The officers for calendar year 2017 are Masa-Aki N. Emesiochl, Chairman; Rev. Billy G. Kuartei, Vice Chair; and Dr. Emais Roberts, Secretary/Treasurer. Also serving on the Board of Trustees is Student Trustee Jediah E. Masahiro. By law, the Student Trustee is elected to the Board to serve as a full fledged voting member representing the interests of the student body. There are currently two (2) vacancies on the Board of Trustees. The Board elected Masa-Aki N. Emesiochl to continue to serve on the College of Micronesia Land Grant Program under each of the three regional colleges. It is a three member governing body with one regent each representing the Federated States of Micronesia, The Republic of The Marshall Islands, and The Republic of Palau. The Board has adopted a schedule to meet regularly on a monthly basis. All board meetings are announced to the public via radio announcements and bulletin postings five days prior to their meeting date. All board meetings, except for executive sessions, are open to the public.

Palau Community College is an accessible public educational institution helping to meet the technical, academic, cultural, social, and economic needs of students and communities by promoting learning opportunities and developing personal excellence.

The Taiwan Scholarship Program is a joint initiative launched by the Ministry of Foreign Affairs (MOFA), the Ministry of Education (MOE), the Ministry of Economic Affairs (MOEA), and the National Science Council (NSC) in 2004. The MOFA Taiwan Scholarship continues to encourage outstanding students to pursue academic degrees in Taiwan and to deepen their understanding of Taiwan's academic environment, thereby enhancing exchanges, and building friendships between Taiwan and their home nations. The MOFA Taiwan Scholarship is, in principle, granted to students from countries that have diplomatic relations with Taiwan. However, special consideration may also be given to students from other countries.

Applications must be submitted to the Republic of China - Taiwan Embassy in Palau (located at the WCTC Shopping Center Building) by March 24, 2017.

Director of Development attends Crisis Emergency Risk Communication (CERC) training

On Tuesday, February 7th, PCC Director of Development Tchuzie Tadao was invited to attend a training seminar at the Penthouse hotel called CERC, which stands for Crisis Emergency Risk Communication. The seminar was conducted by the Public Health Emergency Preparedness office (PHEP-MOH) and focused on training people, who are part of the communication and public relations field, the processes behind disseminating information to the public during a national emergency situation. Most, if not all, organizations or large companies have a person in position who speaks to the media and public on behalf of the company or organization. Within government offices, people in this line of work are referred to as Public Information Officers, or PIO's, similar to a private company's public relations officer. The role of this person in an organization is to be the face and voice of the company that the public can identify with and trust to receive their official news information. One such face most of us already know, for example, would be the ROP President's Press Secretary, Olkeriil Kazuo, who regularly appears on Television and on the radio to share the most up to date information out of the Executive Office of The President.

These PIO's work on behalf of their respective organizations interests, and independently from one another; although, there are certain situations where they are called to work in unity for the sake of sharing centralized information to the general public to avoid mixed messages, for example, during a national crisis. In times of emergency, several agencies including the Ministry of Health (MOH), The Bureau of Public Safety (BPS), and the National Emergency Management Office (NEMO) are tasked to organize and activate the national response plan. During these times of crisis these organizations come together and assign their personnel to each of their respective obligations as Responders. One of the most important responders in these situations are the PIO's who are responsible for getting out information as quickly as possible, through the appropriate channels, to the general public as to try to prevent mass hysteria or panic and to provide safety information and instruction. It is critical that PIO's are trained well before they go in front of the Public to share any information because their use of words, diction, body language and many other factors can greatly affect the Public's reaction. A PIO tasked to calm a panicking crowd can tell his audience "...not to worry, the situation is under control" but if he is noticeably sweaty, shaky, nervous or un-sure of himself, he can make situations worse. That is the purpose of these CERC training seminars; so that in times of crisis we can all work together to prevent any loss of life or property.
