

Institutional Effectiveness Workshop Conducted During Spring Break



PCC Administrators, Faculty, and Staff participated in IE workshop Faculty Senate Association officers joined the College Accreditation Office to provide an Institutional Effectiveness Workshop during the Spring Break on Thursday, April 13, 2017. The workshop concentrated on how the college will move forward using student learning assessment results to ensure institutional effectiveness. The workshop allowed faculty and service providers from the Student Services, Library, and Administration & Finance areas to collaboratively discuss ways to increase institutional effectiveness using data, as well as share ideas on how to continue to implement changes to increase student learning and success. The second part of the workshop has been scheduled for a later date to continue the discussion on how student learning assessment is useful and used when the college has a culture of using good-quality, systematic evidence to make informed decisions, allocate resources, and allow implementation to ensure institutional effectiveness.

There were 64 participants in the workshop including 41 instructors, assistant instructors and adjunct instructors. The other 23 participants represented the Student Services, Library, Administration & Finance areas and classified staff, including divisions and department heads and CSO President.

SAT 10, 2017 Palau Wide Normative Assessment

Stanford Achievement Test (SAT) 10th Edition will be administered to all Palau schools students from grades 1 to 12 on April 25 - 27, 2017. In preparation for the SAT 10 administration, a SAT 10 two-hours training was conducted to all schools administrators, both private and public on Tuesday, April 18, 2017 at the PCC Library conference room. The SAT 10 will be administered by identified proctors from private and public schools with the assistance of test monitors from the Ministry of Education and Palau Community College. SAT 10 is mandated by RPPL 6 - 25, an Education Assessment Act of 2002. SAT 10 is a norm-referenced achievement test that is used to assess the educational performance of Palau's primary and secondary school students, the knowledge, and teaching abilities of the Ministry of Education employees and nonpublic school teachers of core academic subjects through the use of standardized tests.

PacIOOS works to develop the observational, modeling, data management, and outreach components of an end-to-end observing system to generate products that help to ensure a safe, clean, and productive ocean and a resilient coastal zone for the Pacific islands. It provides communities in the Pacific region with easily accessible ocean observation and forecasting information that can help them make well-informed decisions. Based within the School of Ocean and Earth Science and Technology, (SOEST) at the University of Hawaii in Manoa, PacIOOS is one of the (11) regional associations that make up the United States Integrated Ocean Observing System. Islands partnered with PacIOOS include Hawaii, Guam, American Samoa, the Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands (CNMI), the Republic of the Marshall Islands, the Federated States of Micronesia (FSM), the Republic of Palau, and the United States Minor Outlying Islands (Howland, Baker, Johnston, Jarvis, Kingman, Palmyra, Midway, and Wake). Recently, PCC signed a Memorandum of Agreement with PacIOOS.

The College extends its appreciation to Mr. Ellis and Ms. Langenberger for visiting us and looks forward to continuing our partnership as well as future visits by them.
