PCC Hosts 19th Science Students Symposium

On Wednesday, May 04, 2017 a student symposium was held at the Conference Room of the Tan Siu Lin Palau Community College (PCC) Library. The symposium featured Environmental/Marine Science Student Rubie Gabriel who interned at the Palau International Coral Reef Center (PICRC) during this spring semester 2017. As an intern, Ms. Gabriel monitored the coral recruitment rate on the outer reef east and outer west in order to examine how benthic coverage may affect coral recruitment. She also compared recruitment rate among sites within each habitat. The aim of this study was to gain a deeper understanding about coral recruitment processes on the outer reefs of Palau after a major typhoon disturbances.

The main methodology for this study was the use of settlement tiles at several sites on the outer reefs of Palau to examine coral recruitment patterns. Tiles were deployed months before spawning events and were retrieved four months later during 3 time periods. Ms. Gabriel also relied on data collected in previous surveys conducted by PICRC. 
AANAPISI Transfer/ Counseling Workshop

Association of Community College Trustees

May 01, 2017: Following is a statement from J. Noah Brown, President of ACCT. This Morning, Congress released a bipartisan bill funding the federal government for the remainder of the fiscal year (FY 2017). The bill is expected to be considered and passed this week. Included in the bill is the restoration of Year-Round Pell Grants. The Association of Community College Trustees (ACCT), our members, and our students across the country have urged Congress throughout the past year to restore Year-Round Pell Grants. We commend and thank the 115th Congress for listening, and for taking this important bipartisan action. In particular, we thank and commend Senator Patty Murray (D-Wash); Senator Roy Blunt (R-Mo); Congressman Tom Cole (R-Okla); Congresswoman Rosa Delauro (D-Conn); and Congresswoman Lucille Royball-Allard (D-Ca) for their support. Many additional members of congress worked hard to reinstate Year-Round Pell Grant, and we are grateful for their support of community college

The reinstatement of Year-Round Pell Grants will provide low-income students with much-needed assistance to attend college continually. As a result, students will be able to complete their degrees more quickly while relying less on borrowing.

students.

The data showed that western outer reef had a significant higher amount of recruit compared to the eastern outer reef.

Recruitment tiles displayed different benthic communities among study sites, mostly covered by encrusting macroalgae, CCA, and bryozoans. A negative relationship between the density of coral recruits and the coverage of bryozoans was also noted which implies that the success of coral recruitment is lower on reefs that do not receive a lot of coral larvae as they found high competition for space between coral recruits and bryozoans.
