On March 16, 2019, PCC library staff conducted the first FSM & RMI Library Orientation designed to contribute to student success by helping students pick up library skills that they might need for their research and other studies while attending PCC. Fifteen students participated in the session which included a tour of the library (1st & 2nd floors), an explanation of the kind of information that each section of the library holds, and an opportunity to apply for a free library card. The students learned how to use the online catalog so that they could find useful and interesting books in the library's collection, as well as how to search the EBSCO database for articles that they might need when writing research papers. The session ended with a Library Scavenger Hunt to test their new skills. The three students with the most correct answers in the least amount of time won prizes. 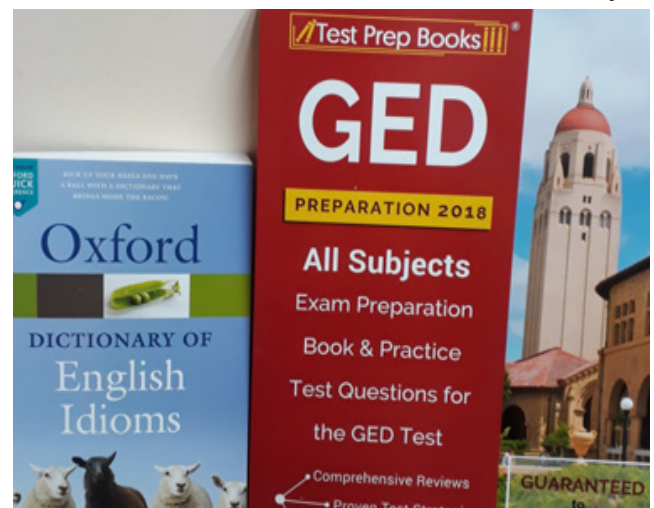
56th MOC-PCC Graduation Committee Commence

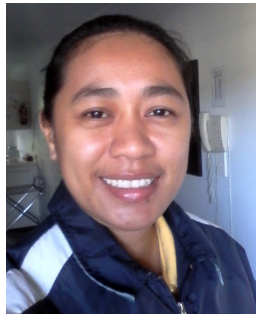

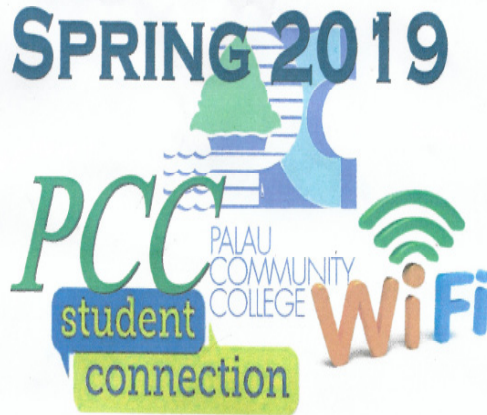

- Your username must be your first name plus the first letter of your last name
 - Example: E-Van Ongrung.....e-vano
 - Example: Mary Jane Goodman.....maryjaneg
 - Example: O.J. Woodward.....ojw
- Your password is your student ID number and it can be found on your PCC student ID card.
 - NOTE: Social Security number is not a password so if your ID number on your student ID card is your SS number then please kindly stop by at Registrars Office and request for your correct student ID number.
