1. General Electronics Associate of Applied Science Degree Program Modification:

Effective fall 2019, EN100 will replace CO110 as the General Education English core course.

- 6. Develop a fundamental understanding of the Social Sciences, including major concepts of social, political, geographic, and economic structures
- III. Curricular Content: All courses are program courses; therefore, a grade of C or better in all courses is needed for graduation.

Social Science:

10 credits

From SS100 and above

9 credits

2 credits

• 2 credits minimum from any HP course (Except HP103)
