1. General Electronics Associate of Applied Science Degree Program Modification:


3. Liberal Arts Program Modification

PROGRAM MODIFICATION PROPOSAL**

I. Rationale: The program is undergoing a modification since new courses have been developed which are approved for the Liberal Arts program and several courses have been renamed, recoded, or deleted.

II. Program Learning Outcomes:

At the completion of this program, students will be able to:

1. Demonstrate proficiency in critical thinking and problem-solving skills;
2. Demonstrate proficiency in the areas of listening, reading, and oral/written communication;
3. Demonstrate proficiency in the areas of computer literacy and information competency/technology;
4. Develop a fundamental understanding of the Humanities including the significance and chronology of major events and movements in Western civilization;
5. Develop a fundamental understanding of the Natural Sciences, including major concepts, principles, and theories of the biological and physical environment;
6. Develop a fundamental understanding of the Social Sciences, including major concepts of social, political, geographic, and economic structures

III. Curricular Content: All courses are program courses; therefore, a grade of C or better in all courses is needed for graduation.
