SDSU Bachelors Cohort TE 530 Course Underway

On April 22, 2019, San Diego State University Bachelors Cohort began their tenth course with Dr. Marva Cappello. TE 530 "Children's /Adolescent Literature" course reintroduces students to the vast array of books available today for children as well as young adults and strategies for using childrens literature in the classroom. At the end of the course, cohort students are able to recognize and distinguish among various genres of childrens literature, understand the values and purposes of literature for children, critically examine the contributions of outstanding authors, and illustrators of children's books, develop and demonstrate a variety of strategies for using children's books, develop skills in evaluating informal literature across the curriculum, apply evaluative criteria to particular childrens books. Dr. Cappello was in Palau from April 22-26, 2019 giving lectures and explanation on the course content prior to her departure to California. Palau Community College extends its warm welcome to Dr. Marva Cappello.

On Thursday, May 02, 2019 Palau Community College (PCC) hosted a lecture series on Dengue Fever. This was made possible with collaborative effort and partnership

with Republic of China -Taiwan Show Chwan Memorial Hospital, Palau Ministry of Health, and PCC.

Ms. Eva Chien from Show Chwan Memorial Hospital co-hosted the lecture which was live streamed from presenter Dr. Tsung-Hua Wu in Taipei. The lecture highlights the background facts of dengue virus, types of mosquito, transmission of the virus, symptoms, treatment, warning signs, physical examination, laboratory tests, and prevention and control. It also includes ROP-Taiwan surveillance mechanism, education strategy, and community mobilization to prevent the spread of denque fever.

Your studentwifi account is activated and ready for your use throughout the semester. But, you need a username and a password to access it.

Following these steps will help you figure out your USERNAME and PASSWORD:

- 1. Your username must be your first name plus the first letter of your last name
 - a. Example: E-Van Ongrung.... b. Example: Mary Jane Goodman.....maryjaneg
 - c. Example: O.J. Woodward.
- Your password is your student ID number and it can be found on your PCC.
 - a. NOTE: Social Security number is not a password so if your ID number on your student ID card is your SS number then please kindly stop by at Registrars Office and request for your correct student ID number.
