PCC Hosts FSM Vice President Meeting

On August 22, 2019 Palau Community College hosted a meeting of FSM nationals with FSM Vice President Yoshiwo P. George and FSM Consul General to the Republic of Palau Chengina Masang. PCC President Dr. Patrick U. Tellei welcomed everyone on behalf of PCC Board of Trustees, administrators, faculty, staff, and Students followed by Counsel General Masang's sincere welcoming remarks. FSM Vice President George gave an update of the FSM Compact of Free Association negotiation-status with high level officials from U.S. Department of State. He also reported on the new fiber optic cable connection which will connect Pohnpei and other FSM States, discussed scholarship opportunities for students, and asked FSM citizens to show appreciation to the host country by respecting Palau laws, customs, and people. Vice President George thanked PCC President Tellei for his continuous support extended to FSM people over the years.

The new library security system by AIR-SEC has an electro-magnetic strip and anti-theft antenna that works together to secure any books if not properly scanned or deactivated by the bookcheck security unit scanner.

With the new gates, both students and staff can now have access to the stairway from the library main floor all the way to Academic Affairs on the third floor.

Acting Director Asito extends her deep appreciation and a big thank you to the maintenance and Library Assistant Mr. Haley-alib for assisting in the installation of the new security gate.

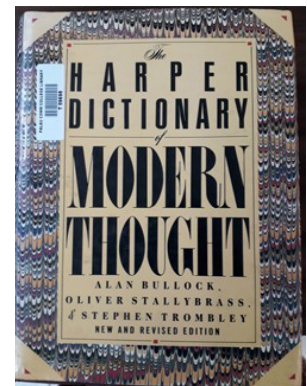
