Monday, Feb. 4th - The PCC basketball team, under the leadership of Recreation Specialist Hamilton Maech, began their best-of-three series against Meda Boys to determine final rankings for the ABL's season ending tournament. The tightly contested game saw many lead changes in the first half and the third quarter. However, with determination, Team Mesekiu managed to secure the lead and never relinquished it and secured a win with the final score of 62 to 56 over a veterans-dominated Medalaii team. Leading the offensive attack were Dougwin Franz-17, Amando Fichmal-14, and Chris Filimew Michael Jackson with 9 points each.

The second game took place on Wednesday, Feb. 6th at 9:00 p.m. with Mesekiu Team eyeing a win to clinch the series and secure a favorable spot in the final rankings. However, with their backs to the wall, the Meda Boys attacked early and quickly took the lead

and maintained it throughout most of the first half. With pressing defense, Mesekiu Team managed to mount a comeback and tied the score to close the first half. The second half was tightly contested with PCC grabbing a two-point lead at 72-70 at the end of the third quarter on Chris's buzzer-beater. However, in the final quarter, relying on their experience and resolve, Meda dominated the game offensively and took the lead and maintained it for a final score of 88 to 74 over Mesekiu. Chris Filimew lead PCC with 22 points, followed by Amando Fichmai with 20.

The final and deciding game was played on Tuesday, Feb. 12th in which Meda displayed their experienceand poise as they dominated the young Mesekiu Team enroute to a lopsided 70 to 50 win to secure a favorable standing in en route season ending tournament. Thompson Muritok lead PCC with 11. With the loss, Mesekiu will likely be ranked 8 in the 16-team tournament which begins next week.
