First Week of Instruction for Summer Session

Palau Community College (PCC) began its summer term on Monday, June 10, 2013. New students and returning students roamed about the school campus as they went from class to class. When asked to comment about their expectations for the new school term, students said that they were eager to complete their course requirements though they will miss the months of summer fun.

On the first day of instruction students are introduced to the course and given a syllabus, an outlined schedule of the school term. The remainder of the week is spent obtaining books and reorganizing classes to fit the students' preferences. Classes may also be dropped or added depending on the week's experience. PCC summer session began on June 10, 2013 and will end on July 24, 2013 spanning over a six-week period.

Otis College Presentation

The students of Otis College of Art and Design currently residing at the dormitories of Palau Community College (PCC) had a presentation on Thursday (June 13, 2013). Part of an art project that began in 2008, the group is on the island to design a Freedom Memorial honoring Palauans who have served and are still serving in the United States Military since the Vietnam War.

Their previous visits were spent researching Palauan culture and meeting local artists. By compiling an understanding about Palau, the students were able to create a design that represented the island's traditions and culture.



Grant Coordinator Visits PCC

Ayumi Yasuda, a grant coordinator for the Embassy of Japan, met with Dr. Patrick Tellei, President of Palau Community College (PCC), on May 27, 2013. Yasuda coordinates the Grants Assistance for the Grass-Roots Human Security Projects (GGP). She met with the Dr. Tellei to share information about the program.

GGP targets nonprofit organizations, non-governmental organizations (NGOs), and development projects instigated by the local community at a grass-root level. Examples of grass-root level projects include constructing local schools, improving medical equipment, and vocational training. The grant assistance aims to upgrade the livelihood of people by providing and improving basic human needs.

EU Ambassador Visits PCC

Palau Community College (PCC) was visited by the Head of the Delegation of the European Union (EU) for the Pacific, Ambassador Andrew Jacobs. During his visit, Ambassador Jacobs examined the EU funded Train-the-Trainer Program currently ongoing at the PCC Electrical Shop. The program participants are taught about grid-connected solar photovoltaics (PV) and how they can be institutionalized. Employees from Palau Public Utilities Corporation (PPUC) and other agencies are currently attending this course. EU has been funding the North Pacific ACP Renewable Energy and Energy Efficiency Project (North REP Project), a project assisting Palau, the Marshall Islands, and the Federated States of Micronesia in the formation of reliable and accessible energy sources. William Thorp, an energy specialist with the North REP Project, orchestrated the solar panel training.

Guam Senator Visits PCC

Guam Democratic Senator, Michael F. Q. San Nicolas, paid a courtesy visit to Palau Community College (PCC) on Thursday, June 06, 2013. According to their presentation, the memorial will follow a spiraling shape design to represent the Palauan tradition of using a conch-shell for callings, specifically war callings. Eight toluk (Palauan women's money) carvings will be place beneath monoliths lining the spiraling design. The memorial will have several bowls submerged in the water visible while the tide is out. Overtime, they will become natural tide pools serving as underwater attractions and homes for marine life. The Freedom Memorial is currently planned to be erected at Long Island Park in Koror, Palau.
