


# **PCC Welcomes AVI Mathematics Development Adviser**

The Australian Volunteers International (AVI) recently dispatched Mathematics Education Development Adviser Dr. Shelly Louise Dole to assist the Ministry of Education and Palau Community College (PCC) improve the quality of mathematics teaching in Palau. She will also help build the capacity of Palauan teachers to deliver the Singapore Mathematics curriculum in schools around the island.

Dr. Dole's assistance falls under the Partnership Agreement between the government of Australia and the government of Palau, an agreement that aims to meet the education targets under Palau-Australia Bilateral Agreement.

PACTAM deployees work with government ministries, statutory authorities, and Pacific regional organizations.

Navigation class students are taught the traditional navigation techniques such as noting the position of stars or observing sea and weather conditions.





# PICRC Researcher Begins Master Program in Japan

Victor Nestor, a Researcher at Palau International Coral Reef Center (PICRC), began a two year Masters of Science program in Okinawa International Marine Sciences Program at the University of the Ryukyus (UoR). The entrance ceremony was held on Friday, October 04, 2013 at University Plaza Building in UoR. It was attended by Mr. Nestor as well as students from Indonesia, Bangladesh, United States, Vietnam, and Sri Lanka.

Mr. Nestor was awarded a full scholarship to attend the Okinawa International Marine Sciences Program at the University of the Ryukyus (UoR). He will specialize in marine science, biology, and chemistry while working closely with his advisor, Dr. James Reimer (Associate Professor of Biology at UoR), to study the impact of coastal development on coral abundance and coverage. The two -year Master of Science Program will include coursework, seminar, and a thesis.

The scholarship is funded by the Japan International Cooperation Agency (JICA) as part of the *Palau Coral Reef and Island Ecosystem Project*, a collaborative project between PICRC and UoR. This scholarship funded by JICA supports thee effort of PICRC to continually enhance and increase its staff capacity. PICRC is committed to the development of its staff and will continue to seek opportunities for its staff either by short term trainings or formal educational degree programs.
