

ROC Delegation Visits CRE Multi-Species Hatchery

On Thursday, January 23, 2014 a delegation from the Taiwan Technical Mission and the National Pingtung University of Science and Technology (NPUST) visited the Palau Community College (PCC) - Cooperative & Research Extension (CRE) Multi-Species Hatchery in Ngermetengel, Ngaremlengui. The group was accompanied by Madame Ambassador Maggie Tien of the Republic of China - Taiwan Embassy in Palau. CRE Vice President Thomas Taro led the tour of the research facility.

The Taiwan Technical Mission provides agricultural assistance to numerous countries including the Asia-Pacific region nations. Visiting the CRE hatchery on behalf of the mission was Richard C. Hung. The mission was established in Palau on May 01, 1985.

NPUST is a university in Taiwan composed of six (6) colleges: College of Agriculture, College of Engineering, College of Management, College of Humanities & Social Sciences, College of International Studies, and the College of Veterinary Medicine. In order to pursue their educational paths, President Tellei also advised the students to take advantage of the free services provided by the college. He encouraged the students to ask for help when needed, especially through the Learning Resource Center (LRC) that provides tutoring in various subjects. In this aspect, President Tellei shared his personal experience with tutoring services. He explained how asking for help is not a sign of ignorance but a show of the student's willingness and determination to learn

President Tellei encouraged the students to voice their concerns especially those which impact their education. He encourage whomever might have an issue to express their concerns with their island group representatives, members of the Associated Students of Palau Community College (ASPCC), or to him personally.

In addition to educational needs President Tellei encouraged the students, especially those from the Federated States of Micronesia (FSM) and the Republic of the Marshall Islands (RMI), to keep informed about the social and political activities in their islands. He stressed that an important part of the PCC Mission Statement is to prepare students to become contributing members of the communities. To fulfill this statement, President Tellei offered to form a means for the FSM and RMI students to participate in their islands' national votes. President Tellei encouraged each student to be expressive, especially about their education while they're in PCC.


