College of Micronesia Board of Regents Meet in Palau

The College of Micronesia (COM) Board of Regents recently held meetings in Palau on the campus of Palau Community College (PCC) and at the PCC Multi-Species Hatchery in Ngermetengel, Ngeremlengui. Attending the meeting were Chairperson Hilda Heine (Republic of the Marshall Islands), Vice Chair Churchill Edward (Federated States of Micronesia), Secretary/Treasurer Masa-Aki N. Emesiochl (Republic of Palau), and Dr. Singeru Singeo, Executive Director of the COM Land Grant.

The following representatives of the three member institutions of the COM Land Grant were also in attendance: PCC President Dr. Patrick U. Tellei, PCC Cooperative Extension & Research (CRE) Vice President Thomas Taro, Associate Director/Dean of College of Marshall Islands Biuma Samson, Associate Director/ Vice President of COM James Currie, and Yap Agriculture Experiment Station Agent George Chuwai.

On Friday, June 13, 2014 the first day of the meeting took place in the PCC Conference Room while the second day of the meeting was held at the Multi-Species Hatchery in Ngeremlengui.

Claude Midgley Visits PCC

Environmental Scientist Claude Midgley visited the campus of Palau Community College (PCC) on Thursday, June 12, 2014. Mr. Midgley is a Senior Environmental Scientist for the Geoscience Consulting (NZ) Limited, a specialist consultation group based in New Zealand. During his visit, Mr. Midgley met with PCC President Dr. Patrick U. Tellei and PCC Director of Plant Clement Kazuma.

The Geoscience Consulting (NZ) Limited was formed in 2010. It provides engineering geological, geophysical, environmental, and geotechnical engineering services worldwide. Members of the group have worked on projects such as residential earthquake recovery in Christchurch and the redevelopment of the Palmerston North Freight Yard in Wellington. The group also extended its services to clients in Africa, the United Kingdom, Australia, and the Pacific region.

Strategic National Stockpile Training

A Strategic National Stockpile (SNS) Preparedness Course was hosted at the Palau Community College (PCC) Assembly Hall on Tuesday, June 17, 2014. A total of fifty-one (51) people participated in the training including trainers and trainees from American Samoa, Hawaii, the Republic of the Marshall Islands (RMI), the Federated States of Micronesia (FSM), Guam, the Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands (CNMI), and Palau. The preparedness course was a part of the second Pacific Islands Preparedness and Emergency Response Summit (PIPER) being hosted in Palau.

The Strategic National Stockpile Preparedness Course was designed to provide an overview of the SNS program. It also gave the participants' roles and responsibilities in medical counter-measure distribution and medical material management & distribution. The training not only explained the mission and operations of the SNS Program, it also alerted state and local emergency response officials to the important issues they must plan for in order to receive, secure, and distribute SNS assets.

Security training for the SNS assets, which includes presentation in security during an emergency and the role of security in an SNS deployment, was also a focus point of the training. The SNS Preparedness Course was conducted in partnership with the CNMI Department of Homeland Security and the CNMI Department of Public Safety. Instructors for the security training were Captain Melvin Manahane, Sergeant Eusabio Manglona, and Lead Instructor Jason Tarkong.

Members of the PCC Executive Committee were invited to the second-day meeting and luncheon which was hosted by the PCC-CRE. The next COM Board of Regents meeting will be held in Guam on December

Following the meeting, the Board of Regents issued its directives for implementation which included the approval of the FY2014 Consolidated Budget, approval of extra compensation plan for multi-states/multi-sites research projects, and an expression of support for the COM Endowment Fund target of \$7 million within two years.

The three-member Board of Regents is tasked with the governance and administration of the College of Micronesia Land Grant Program. Its members are appointed representatives of the three signatory governments (Republic of Palau, Republic of the Marshall Islands, and Federated States of Micronesia) to the College of Micronesia Treaty.

PCC Main Parking Lot Undergoes Improvement
