The Office of Admissions & Financial Aid staff, Director Katosang, and Financial Aid Counselor Olengellel conducted a total of twenty-one (21) Financial Aid Orientation 2 (FA02) sessions for all financial aid recipients, including the applicants. The FA02 sessions started on September 20, 2014 and concluded on Friday, October 17, 2014. Attending FA02 sessions is a mandatory requirement before students' financial aid awards are transmitted to the PCC Business Office. Out of 516 eligible applicants, 508 (98%) were able to attend the sessions.

The Embassy of Switzerland (Diplomatic Note No. 13/2014 to the Palau Ministry of State) will grant postgraduate excellency scholarship to foreign researchers and students through the Swiss Federation Commission for Scholarships for Foreign Students (FCS). Interested individuals from the Republic of Palau will be eligible for application this academic year 2015-2016.

Applications must be submitted to the Ministry of State no later than November 10, 2014, one week before the actual deadline on November 17, 2014 for review and official transmittal to the Embassy of Switzerland.


