

The Upward Bound Program provides fundamental support and opportunities for high school students who seek to succeed in their precollege performance and ultimately their higher education endeavors. Its goal is to increase the rate at which its participants complete secondary education and enroll in/graduate from institutions of higher education. Upward Bound provides services such as tutoring in English writing, literature, foreign language, mathematics, and science as well as extra-curricular activities such as the work-study summer program.
