Each intern has been assigned to work on a project under the mentorship of a PICRC researcher, post-doctoral researcher, or a head of a department. The interns for this summer are Yubee K. Isaac (Palau Community College), Lincy Lee Marino (Mount Holyoke College in Massachusetts), Mailie N. Rechirei (University of Guam, and Elchung G. Hideyos (Chaminade University in Hawaii).

Ms. Marino is studying International Relations on Environmental Policy & Development with a minor in Economics and the Chinese (Mandarin) Language. She is mentoring under postdoctoral fellow, Dr. Yeong Shyan Yuen, and will be working with data and analysis for the Palau Reef Island Ecosystem (P-CoRIE) Project. Her internship is funded by the Lynk Universal Application Funding (UAF). She is a recipient of the Palau Fellowship Award sponsored by the Palau National Scholarship Board.

Ms. Rechirei, who is an alumna of Palau Community College, is a Biology Major at the University of Guam. Under the mentorship of PICRC Researcher Shirley Koshiba, Ms. Rechirei is will learn about the marine ecosystems and methods of conserving & improving protected areas. She is, along with Ms. Marino, also recipient of the Palau Fellowship Award.


Instructor Morei Donates to Endowment

The representatives discussed the learning options available for the exchange students. Students from Hyogo University may spend a month in Palau participating in a non-credit English language learning course under the Continuing Education (CE) Division of PCC or they may enroll in the offered programs as full-time students. Students from PCC may, in exchange, spend an entire school year studying at Hyogo University. They also discussed the possible living arrangement for the students.

Hyogo University is a private university located in Kakogawa in the Hyogo Prefecture of Japan. Hyogo Prefecture holds a sister city status with Palau. The university currently has three (3) campuses: the Kakogawa Campus, the Suma Campus, and the Takakuradai Campus.

The parent body of the university is Mutsumi School Foundation, a foundation that was founded in 1921 with the aim to guide children through the spirit of harmony which is rooted in the Buddhism faith. Hyogo University currently offers studies in fields such as nursing, economics & information service, childhood education, and social welfare.
