Environmental/Marine Science Students Symposium

On Wednesday, July 22, 2015 the students who recently completed their Field Studies & Internship under the Environmental/Marine Science Program held a symposium at the Assembly Hall of Palau Community College (PCC). The symposium was an opportunity for the students to showcase the projects that they conducted for their field studies. Each student worked with a different agency in Palau involved with environmental projects.

The students featured in this symposium were Yubee K. Isaac, Evan Fritz, and Jason Aderiano. Ms. Isaac interned at the Palau International Coral Reef Center (PICRC) where she helped assess the marine protected areas. Both Mr. Fritz and Mr. Aderiano worked with the Palau Environmental Quality Protection Board (EQPB). Mr. Fritz focused on a project that analyzed the quality of water supplied to Babeldaob. Tokai Representatives Visit PCC

On Wednesday, July 29, 2015 two (2) representatives from Tokai University in Japan visited the campus of Palau Community College (PCC). Professor Dr. Masafumi Chiba is an English Professor for the Tokai University - School of Science and Mr. Hideyoshi Taguma is the Head of the Tokai University - Office of International Affairs. The 2015 Belau National Tourism Conference was hosted by the Palau Visitors Authority, the Palau Chamber of Commerce, and the Belau Tourism Association.

From July 28, 2015 to July 29, 2015 the 2015 Belau National Business & Finance Conference was also hosted at the PCC Cafeteria. ASSESSMENT OF EBIIL MPAS & REFERENCE SITE BY YUBEE K. ISAAC

As a part of her Field Studies & Internship for her Environmental/Marine Science Program, Yubee K. Isaac conducted an assessment of the Marine Protected Areas (MPAS) and reference site in the Ebiil Channel of the northern reefs between Ngarchelong State and Kayangel State. Her assessment focused on collecting data on important fish abundance and biomass, invertebrate densities, benthic cover, and coral recruitment for long-term monitoring. Ms. Isaac conducted her field studies under the mentorship of PICRC Researcher Evelyn I. Otto.



QUALITY OF THE BABELDAOB WATER SUPPLY SYSTEMS BY EVAN FRITZ



Evan Fritz conducted his Field Studies & Internship with the Palau Environmental Quality Protection Board (EQPB). His project focused on examining the water quality of the Water Supply Systems (WSS) for Babeldaob. Mr. Fritz collected water samples from the National Capital Building in Ngerulmud, Melekeok and samples from private sites, such as the private stores and local school. He also visited known sample sites in states of Ngaraard, Ngatpang, Aimeliik, Ngiwal, Ngarchelong, and Ngardmau. Samples were tested using Colilert™ which is a water testing product that is used to detect coliforms and *Escherichia coli* (E. coli). Using the Quanti-Tray Most Probable Number (MPN) Table, results of the tested water samples were calculated according to their probability number of coliform bacteria. Mr. Fritz concluded from his tests that the current status of water in Babeldaob is acceptable. He implored Palauans to be more considerate of their water management agencies and suggests that the equipment/methods used by EQPB to examine Palau's water supply be upgraded.

SIGNIFICANCE OF SILT CURTAINS BY JASON ADERIANO

Jason Aderiano also conducted his Field Studies & Internship with the Palau Environmental Quality Protection Board (EQPB). His project involved examining the silt curtains currently being used by EQPB located at the Koror Side of the Palau-Japan Friendship Bridge and Malakal (George Kebekol Project). Silt curtains are used to contain & enclose the turbidity levels of water at construction sites in order to limit the transportation of fine material to areas of higher turbidity levels. This prevents and limits the damage made to the environment due to construction projects. Upon inspection, Mr. Aderiano concluded that the silt curtains currently being used in the two project sites are of poor condition. Because of the lack of knowledge about and experience by the users, the silt curtains current fail to meet the Environmental Assessment required by EQPB. Thus, the marine environment is in risk due to lack of proper silt curtain usage. Mr. Aderiano comments that silt curtains are important defenses against damaging the marine environment and advises that the users be properly educated in the deployment procedures of the curtains.
