ASPCC Student Election Announcement

The Palau Community College (PCC) Office of Student Services has announced that the election for Student Trustee and Associated Students of Palau Community College (ASPCC) officers & senators will take place on Wednesday, September 09, 2015. The following are the qualification for officers/senators and student trustee (student representative to the PCC Board of Trustees):

- 1) Student must be full-time (12 credits or more) and maintain a Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA) of 2.00 or above
- 2) Student must have no felony record or criminal offense
- 3) Class representation shall be composed of four (4) students: two (2) freshmen students and two (2) sophomore
- 4) Officers shall be from the following classes:
 - A. Student Trustee Sophomore or Freshman with at least one full-time term prior to election
 - B President Sophomore with a minimum of 30 Credits towards current major
 - C. President-Elect Freshman with a minimum of 18 Credits toward a major
 - D. Secretary Sophomore or Freshman
 - E. <u>Treasurer</u> Sophomore or Freshman





- 1) Candidates for the Board of Trustees, Senate Officers, and Class Representatives shall register at the Office of the Dean of Students no later than <u>THURS-DAY</u>, SEPTEMBER 03, 2015 @ 4:30PM
- 2) Candidates must acquire a <u>PETITION FORM WITH THE SIGNATURE OF</u>
 <u>AT LEAST TWENTY-FIVE (25) CLASSIFIED STUDENTS</u> which must be submitted to the Office of the Dean of Students on or before <u>THURSDAY</u>, <u>SEPTEMBER 03, 2015 @ 4:30PM</u>
- 3) Election of Student Trustee, ASPCC Officers, and Class Representatives will take place on WEDNESDAY, SEPTEMBER 09, 2015 and will be held at the PCC MESEKIU BAI from 8AM to 5PM
