Frank Cruz Visits PCC Campus

On Tuesday, August 18, 2015 Frank Cruz visited the campus of Palau Community College (PCC). Mr. Cruz is an Officer of the Traditions About Seafaring Islands (TASI) Board in Guam. He was accompanied by Agriculturalist Trebkul Tellei from the Palau Bureau of Agriculture. They met with PCC President Dr. Patrick U. Tellei and Cooperative Research & Extension (CRE) Agent/Research Assistant Lyndon Masami. During their meeting, PCC President Dr. Tellei informed Mr. Cruz about the efforts being made by the Micronesian Voyaging Society (MVS) to send a master navigator, along with voyaging students, to participate in the upcoming Pacific Festival of Arts that will be hosted by Guam in May 2016. The master navigator & students will set sail from Palau, to the island of Satawal in Yap, and then arrive in Guam.

Ms. Tanigawa is also a radio journalist who does stories on art & culture in Hawaii for the Hawaii Public Radio.


