From September 21, 2015 to September 25, 2015 the Cooperative Research & Extension (CRE) Division of Palau Community College (PCC) conducted an Expanded Food & Nutrition Education Program (EFNEP) and Food Technology Training at the Airai Ked Center. A group of twenty-three (23) women participated in the training.

EFNEP and the Food Technology Training aim to provide families in Palau with information about basic nutrition based on locally grown ingredients & supplies. The program and training provided demonstrations on how to create healthy meals with local ingredients and tips on safe food-handling & storage that can help improve personal eating habits. ## Dr. Richard C. Seder Visits PCC

Dr. Richard C. Seder visited the campus of Palau Community College (PCC) on Tuesday, October 13, 2015. During his visit, Dr. Seder met with members of the PCC Executive Committee to discuss ideas on how the college could better evaluate & improve its programs. Dr. Seder focused on logic models versus improvement science as program evaluation tools. A logic model outlines the resources, activities, outputs, and outcomes without room for performance variation. In comparison, improvement science is built on six (6) core principles: (1) making the work problem-centered & user-centered; (2) addressing the variation in performance as the core problem; (3) seeing the system that produces the current outcomes; (4) improving on scale what can be measured; (5) anchoring practice improvement in disciplined inquiry; and (6) accelerating improvements through networked communities. Dr. Seder is the Director of Education Partnerships for RTI International, a non-profit research institution dedicated to the improvement of the human condition by putting knowledge into practice. In the past, he has worked for McREL as an Assistant Director for the Pacific Regional Educational Laboratory in association with the United States Department of Education.

## **Czech Republic Donates Books to PCC**

The Czech Republic Ambassador to the Republic of Palau Jaroslav Olša Jr. recently presented a donation of thirty (30) books to Palau Community College (PCC). The donation was officially received by PCC President Dr. Patrick U. Tellei. It included various books and publications about the history & culture of the Czech Republic as well as novels written by popular Czech Republic writers.

While presenting the books, Ambassador Olša Jr. mentioned that the Government of the Czech Republic was interested in sharing its culture & history with countries around the world, especially countries with a small population of people from the Czech Republic. By providing a collection of books about his country, Ambassador Olša Jr. hopes to entice students as well as people in the community of Palau to learn about, and perhaps someday visit, the Czech Republic.

Included in the donation were the works of worldrenowned Czech novelists Karel Čapek and Milan Kundera as well as the English translated works of Bohumil Hrabal, Jsef Škvoreckŷ, Miloš Urban, and Martin Vopěnka. Mr. Kundera's book entitled"The Unbearable Lightness of Being" was translated into a dozen languages and became a major Hollywood film. The translated works of Czech Republic Nobel Prize Winning Poem Jaroslav Seifert, and the famous Prague writer Franz Kafka, are also included in the donation.

The books presented by Ambassador Olša Jr. are available at the Tan Siu Lin PCC Library. All are encouraged to visit the library and enjoy the new additions!




