The conference was held at the Ernest N. Morial Convention Center in New Orleans, Louisiana USA.

Featured at the conference were workshops, booths, education sessions, and resources that promoted technical education. Accreditation Standards Update

Since last week, the Palau Community College (PCC) Accreditation Steering Committee (ASC) has been working diligently to compile evidence for the Institutional Self-Evaluation Report of the college. The ASC is composed of four (4) standards: Standard I - Mission, Academic Quality & Institutional Effectiveness, and Integrity; Standard II - Student Learning Programs and Services: Standard III - Resources; and Standard IV - Leadership & Governance. Members of each must compile evidence that support and address the dialogue under their respect standards for accreditation purposes. The Institutional Self-Evaluation Report provides a written analysis of a strengths and weaknesses of a learning institution. It is based on the continued evaluation conducted by the college and analyzes the quality of its improvements.

PCC-Based Scholarships Currently Open

Palau Community College (PCC) would like to inform the student body that two (2) PCC-Based Scholarships are currently available: the David W. Shipper Memorial Scholarship and the Sandra S. Pierantozzi Scholarship. Both scholarships will remain open until applications are completed & submitted to the PCC Development Office (there is no deadline). Recipients will receive \$500 each academic year (\$250 per semester) to assist with their school costs and related expenses. Only one (1) recipient will be selected for the David W. 
