Current SDSU Masters Program Cohort of Palau

Dr. Caren Sax and Dr. Sylvia Garcia-Navarrete were recently at Palau Community College (PCC) to initiate and complete courses for the current bachelors & masters cohorts under the San Diego State University (SDSU). They concluded the final course (ARP-499: Special Study Required for Undergraduates) for the SDSU Bachelors Cohort and initiated the Masters Cohort ARP-755: Governance & Policy Development for Post-Secondary Learning Environment Course.

Dr. Sax is Professor and Chair of the Department of Administration, Rehabilitation, and Postsecondary Education at SDSU. She is also the Co-Director of the SDSU Interwork Institute. Dr. Garcia-Navarrete holds a Doctorate Degree in Educational Leadership from SDSU. In the past, she has assisted PCC instructors develop courses that promote student engagement. She is also known for developing Our Reading Toolbox, a thinking-centered intervention in community college developmental reading classes that aims to help students improve their reading comprehension and writing skills.

From December 16, 2015 to December 17, 2015 fifteen (15) members of the Palau Research Alliance held their final training/workshop at the Conference Room of the Tan Siu Lin Palau Community College (PCC) Library. The members focused on finalizing the draft of the Implementation Plan for Alcohol Use in Youth. The Collective Impact Training was sponsored by the Pacific Regional Education Lab (PREL) in collaboration with the Ministry of Education. It was led by the Locally-Based Consultant, Ms. Berry Moon Watson. The core members of the Palau Research Alliance are from the Ministry of Health, the Ministry of Education, the Ministry of Justice, the Ministry of Community & Cultural Affairs, the Ministry of State, PCC, and the Palau National Olympic Committee. A major objective of the Palau Research Alliance and the Collective Impact Initiative is the engagement of all Palauan citizens. The alliance members have reached out to the youth, political & traditional leaders, families, and influential community members as an effort in influencing as well as encouraging practices toward a positive outcome of decreased youth alcohol consumption in Palau.

In previous training sessions, the Palau Research Alliance adopted the following strategic directions for reducing the use of alcohol in the youth population: (1) create a community-based inter-agency collaboration to work to reduce alcohol consumption & distribution in the youth population; (2) develop information gathering and sharing systems across agencies for use in prevention; (3) prevention of alcohol use in youths; and (4) development of alcohol use & abuse promotion, protection, preventive model programs appropriate for the youth of Palau.

The Collective Impact Initiative recognizes that the issue of alcohol use in youth has become national issue and that it takes all of our collective effort as a nation to address it. In the past two (2) trainings, an agenda of five (5) mutually reinforcing strategies was developed. This third training focused on translating these strategies into activities that can be adopted in the workplace/communities as ways for each of member of the community to undertake the reduction of alcohol usage in the Palauan youth.

In this final training/workshop, a draft Implementation Plan was finalized and will be submitted to each member agency. The Palau Research Alliance also submitted the document to the Ministry of Education. Minister of Education Sinton Soalablai will submit the plan to the Palau National Coordinating Mechanism for Non-Communicable Diseases (NCD). If adopted, the plan can be considered as a ministerial approach to the issue of alcohol as prescribed by the National NCD Strategic Plan (Strategic Direction of Alcohol Use Reduction).
