On Friday, January 15, 2016 an opening ceremony for the Strato-Climate Atmospheric Observatory in Palau was hosted at the Assembly Hall of Palau Community College (PCC). In a Memorandum of Understanding with the Alfred Wegener Institute (AWI) in Germany, the college agreed to be the site for the Palauan atmospheric observatory as part of the StratoClim Project.

The ceremony began with remarks from Honorary Consul Schubert. He recognized the German scientists and experts currently in Palau installing & operating atmospheric observatory: Mr. Ingo Benigna, Mr. Winfried Markert, and Ms. Katrin Müller. He was followed by the welcoming remarks of PCC President Dr. Tellei.

A presentation by Dr. Markus Rex followed. Dr. Rex is the Senior Scientist of the AWI Helmholtz Center for Polar and Marine Science. In his presentation, Dr. Rex explained how a pilot study had determined the air around Palau as the cleanest in the world. Due to this fact, Palau is the ideal location for conducting studies on how climate and air from our region affect the composition of the stratosphere globally.

Having an atmospheric observatory in Palau will lead to in-depth understanding of the stratosphere which will fill the current gap in global observational networks. Information on atmospheric composition of the tropical West Pacific warm pool is also very limited and the Palau Atmospheric Observatory will provide much needed data.

Minister Temengil followed Dr. Rex with her special remarks followed by the ribbon-cutting ceremony. Senator Pierantozzi, Honorary Consul Schubert, Dr. Rex, and PCC President Dr. Tellei were invited to cut the ribbon. After the closing remarks of Honorary Consul Schubert, the audience was invited to visit and examine the atmospheric observatory located next the PCC Cafeteria.

The atmospheric observatory is equipped with instruments that measure the stratospheric ozone & aerosol, the distribution of water vapor, and the abundance of other trace gases in the atmosphere. It is a part of the StratoClim Project that is composed of thirty-two (32) atmospheric research institutions from eleven (11) European countries. Data collected from these observatories will improve the representation of atmospheric processes and our overall understanding of climate change. This project is funded by the European Union.
