## PCC Students Return from Sophia University

Recently, two (2) students from Palau Community College (PCC) participated in a short-term academic program at the Sophia University in Japan. As part of the <u>Pacific Islands and West Indies Student Invitation Project</u>, Mengiau Sasao and Tyra Asanuma spent three (3) weeks learning about the key aspects of contemporary Japan such as its language, media, and economy. Sophia University is a private Jesuit research university in the Chiyoda Ward of Tokyo, Japan. It is ranked as one of the top private universities in Japan.

This short-term academic program was sponsored by the Association for Promotion of International Cooperation (APIC), a Japanese general incorporated foundation dedicated to strengthening the cooperation & mutual understanding between Japan and other countries. Ms. Sasao is a PCC student enrolled in the Science, Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics (STEM) Disciplines Program and Ms. Asanuma is a second-year in the Information Technology Program. They were the first Palauan students selected to participate in this program.

#### **Table-Top Gardens Distributed**

The Palau Community College (PCC) Cooperative Research & Extension (CRE) Department, in collaboration with the Solid Waste Management Office of the Koror State Government (KSG), recently distributed kang kum/ nappa table-top gardens to fifty (50) home-bound community members in Palau. This project aimed to assist home-bound community members and take steps toward food security in Palau. On February 04, 2016 Palau Minister of Community & Cultural Affairs Baklai Temengil-Chilton and Ministry of Health Non-Communicable Disease Unit Program Manager Edolem Ikerdeu were invited to witness the distribution of the table-top gardens. Also present were PCC Board of Trustees member Jemmy Blelai, PCC Student Trustee Rdiall L. Tellei, PCC President Dr. Patrick U. Tellei, PCC-CRE Vice President Thomas Taro, and KSG Solid Waste Management Office Coordinator John Ngiraked, Jr. CRE, continued on page 3

#### **Recruitment & Financial Aid Meetings**

Representatives from the Palau Community College (PCC) Office of Admissions & Financial Aid, Academic Affairs Office, and the Office of Student Services conducted a series of recruitment meetings with the local high schools from February 01, 2016 to February 09, 2016. Financial aid sessions were conducted in the evenings while recruitment meetings & high school visits were conducted during the day. PCC representatives who participated in these recruitment efforts included PCC Director of Admissions & Financial Aid Dahlia M. Katosang, PCC Dean of Students Sherman Daniel, PCC Dean of Academic Affairs Robert Ramarui, and Admissions & Financial Aid Counselor Sione Fakatou.

Recruitment meetings focused on providing high school seniors with information about PCC programs, services, and admissions requirements. Presentations covered the general education and career & technical education degree programs of the college. Interested high school seniors were provided with admissions application forms and college representatives provided assistance in completing them.

The financial aid meetings covered information regarding the federal student aid programs and eligibility requirements. Financial aid forms were also distributed to and completed by interested high school seniors. Parents were invited to accompany the students during these financial aid meetings.

The recruitment efforts of the college reached all of the five (5) local high schools: Emmaus High School, Mindszenty High School, Palau Mission Academy, Belau Modekngei School, Bethania High School, and Palau High School.

#### **MOE Hosts School Emergency Workshop**

From February 08, 2016 to February 12, 2016 the Palau Ministry of Education (MOE) hosted a School Emergency Management Planning, Development, and Preparedness Workshop II at the Palau Community College (PCC) Assembly Hall. It began with a review of the existing emergency plans & steps set in place for the local schools in Palau. A presentation that reviewed the school emergency plans was given by MOE Division of Research & Evaluation Chief Ray Mechol. Ministry of Health Program Manager Ms. Ikerdeu highlighted how the project could help Palau in its fight again non-communicable diseases. Table-top gardens would encourage the local population to grow and eat vegetables & fruits which will lead to an improvement in food and lifestyle choices.

KSG Solid Waste Management Coordinator Ngiraked also commented about the project. He recognized the efforts of the PCC-CRE and the college in helping the community of Palau. He also mentioned how the project was helping the Palau National Government achieve its food security goals. By promoting local production of food through efforts such as table-top gardens, Palauans will have a food source in case of natural disasters such as droughts.

The first day of the workshop covered information about the International Organization for Migration (IOM). IOM is an inter-governmental organization known for its dynamic work in the field of migration. IOM Education Consultant on Disaster Risk Reduction Ms. Alyson Gombas provided an overview of the organization's activities in the Federated States of Micronesia, the Republic of the Marshall Islands, and the Republic of Palau.

Also covered by the IOM team was information regarding the Climate Adaptation, Disaster Risk Reduction, and Education (CADRE) Program. Funded by AusAID, CADRE aims to build the resilience of vulnerable communities in Micronesia against natural hazards especially those that are related to climate change. In partnership with IOM, CADRE provides these vulnerable areas with training & information about climate change adaptation and disaster preparedness.

The workshop also provided training that covered preparedness for medical emergencies and natural disasters. Representatives from the Palau Red Cross Society taught participants about Cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) & first-aid response. A fire drill at the Koror Elementary School and a tsunami at Melekeok Elementary School prepared participants for natural disasters that could occur in Palau.

Palau National Emergency Management Office (NEMO) Coordinator Ms. Priscilla Subris highlighted the role of the Ministry of Education in the National Disaster Preparedness Framework. A presentation by the Bureau of Public Safety introduced participants to the proper responses in relation to fires, earthquakes, and search & rescue (SAR). The Ministry of Health focused on medical emergencies, especially responding to a medical emergency occurring at school. Ms. Maria Ngemaes from the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA) held a presentation regarding early warning systems.

Participants of the workshop will receive certificates for completing the CPR/First-Aid Training, School Emergency Management Planning (SEMP), and the fire & tsunami drills.
