PCC Student & Professor Attend Island Sustainability Conference

The 7th Regional Conference on Island Sustainability (CIS2016) was hosted at the Lotte Guam Resort from April 11, 2016 to April 15, 2016. Palau Community College (PCC) Environmental/Marine Science Student Neola E. West attended the conference with PCC Associate Professor of Science Vernice Yuzi. The event was cohosted by the University of Alaska Fairbanks and the University of Guam (UOG) Center for Island Sustainability.

Ms. West prepared a poster presentation titled "Conservation: A Bond Between the Past and the Future" that highlighted the Palauan traditional practice of *bul*. *Bul* is a fishing ban that is set by traditional leaders of Palau in order to preserve or restore the island's fish population. In modern times, Palau has applied its traditional ban in its establishment as a national marine sanctuary.

Transition Workshop Hosted at PCC

From Thursday, April 14, 2016 to Friday, April 15, 2016 a workshop aimed at eighth grade students from local elementary schools in Palau was held at the Palau Community College (PCC) Cafeteria. The workshop focused on providing the students with advice as well as information that may help them succeed socially & academically in their upcoming four (4) years of high school.

The first day opened with a prayer from Pastor John Zimmer. After the national anthem was sung, Minister of Education Sinton Soalablai gave his welcoming remarks. Keynote Address Speaker Dr. Stevenson Kuartei followed with a presentation about basing the Palauan learning environment on the culture, traditions, and social experiences of the Pacific island child. The students then learned about the habits of successful people.

Ms. Josepha Tiobech, a retired Palauan nurse, followed with special remarks. Afterwards, the students participated in activities designed to help build their sense of teamwork. This was also an opportunity for the students to meet and learn more about each other. The first day of the workshop closed with remarks from Aimeliik Elementary School Principal Jeremiah Tem.

The next day, students took a mathematics placement test while parents participated in a parental workshop. Presenters from the Ministry of Health (MOH) Family Health Unit advised the parents on how to raise their children as they enter their adolescent stage. They discussed the importance of respecting a child's personal boundaries, especially as they grow into their own person. The day ended with remarks from MOE Director of Education Administration Andrew
