PCC Holds 53rd Commencement Exercises Today

Today marks the 53rd Commencement Exercises of Palau Community College (PCC)! A total of fifty-eight (58) graduates are receiving their degrees from PCC; twenty-one (21) graduates are receiving their bachelor's degrees from San Diego State University (SDSU); fourteen (14) graduates have completed the Substance Abuse Treatment Counseling Program; and fifteen (15) graduates have completed the PCC Adult High School Program.

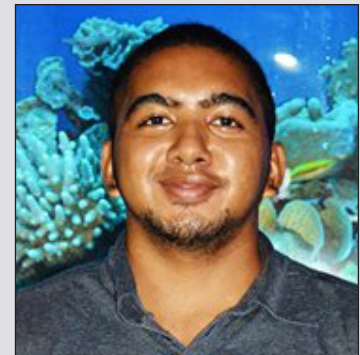

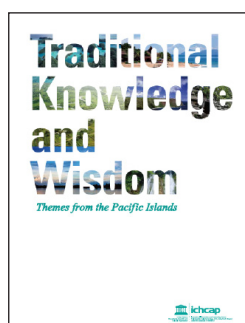
