PCC President Holds Meetings with Students

Tellei met with students from the Republic of the Marshall Islands (RMI) and Kosrae State of the Federated States of Micronesia (FSM). The meetings were an opportunity for PCC President Dr. Tellei to welcome both new and returning students to the fall semester.

In his remarks, Dr. Tellei thanked the students for choosing the college as the next step in their educational pursuits. He advised the students to prioritize their studies by finding a balance between their academic and social obligations. The students were in college in order to complete their academic studies and the college was more than willing to provide the necessary assistance.

PCC Welcomes Dr. J. Luke Wood

Dr. J. Luke Wood from the San Diego State University (SDSU) Interwork Institute was recently in Palau teaching classes for the Masters of Arts in **Education Cohort at Palau Community** College (PCC). Dr. Wood focused on procedures of investigation which are essential to academic studies and research. Currently, twenty-seven (27) students are part of the SDSU Master of Arts in Education Cohort. The Procedures of Investigation Course focuses on research methods used in education and related fields. Research methods focus on location, selection, and analysis of professional literature. The course also explores the methods of investigation especially for data analysis and reporting. Dr. J. Luke Wood is an SDSU Associate Professor of Community College Leadership and the Director of the SDSU Doctoral Program in Community College Leadership. SDSU, continued on page 3

Dr. Wood received his PhD (2010) in Educational Leadership & Policy Studies with an emphasis in Higher Education from Arizona State University (ASU). He also holds a Master's Degree in Higher Education Leadership with a concentration in Student Affairs and a Bachelor's Degree in Black History & Politics from California State University in Sacramento.

Dr. Wood is well-known for academic researches that focus on the success rate of men of color in the community college setting. His research identifies factors that effect the success rate of men of color and how these factors can create positive outcomes for their learning careers. Dr. Wood has written over a hundred scholarly articles and his research has been featured by the White House Initiative on Educational Excellence for African Americans, *New York Times*, *Chronicle of Higher Education*, *Huffington Post*, C-SPAN, and National Press Club.


