The 2016-2017 Associated Students of Palau Community College (ASPCC) Elections were held on Wednesday, September 14, 2016. Of the 587 students currently enrolled at the college, 140 students (120 freshmen and 20 sophomores) casted their votes resulting in a 24% turn-out for this school year's elections. Community & Public Health: "The New Kid in Town"

There are two (2) degree programs that have recently been added to the School of Arts & Sciences here at Palau Community College: Community and Public Health Program (CPH) and Palauan Studies. CPH offers an Associate of Science degree in Public Health. The Associate of Science Degree Program in Public Health is designed to provide a sound grounding in basic public health knowledge, attitude & skills, as well as in selected specialized disciplines and topics, for public health practitioners in management and implementation of Projects and interventions in the community. Both junior College candidates and adult, workforce Members are encouraged to enroll, as the Program also aims at better preparing and equipping successful graduates to continue their studies in either general Public Health or in the specialized Disciplines of Applied Epidemiology and Health Research; Environmental Health, Food and Nutrition; Health Promotion; and Health Services Management, at graduate [Bachelor] and Postgraduate [Master; Doctorate] levels. A specialized "track" in Emergency Health Management - 1 is offered, providing knowledge, attitude and skills in the management of health matters during disasters. Other "tracks", in Nutrition, Environmental Health, etc., are being designed and will soon be offered.
