PPUC Line Crew Wiring Demonstration for PCC Students



PPUC Lineman demonstrates practical wiring applications for PCC students


On Tuesday, October 04, 2016 linemen from the Palau Public Utilities Corporation (PPUC) set up a demonstration for the students currently enrolled in the Electrical Technology Program of Palau Community College (PCC). The demonstration was organized by PCC Electrical Technology Instructors Frutoso Tellei and Jerry Taroy in collaboration with PPUC General Manager/Chief Executive Officer Kione Isechal.

The PPUC Line Crew made a model of an electrical line pole and transformer. The demonstration focused on providing the students with hands-on experience with practical wiring applications specific to the Industrial/Commercial Wiring Class of the program. This was also an opportunity for the students to learn a variety of wiring and connection configurations involving transformers to suit industrial & electrical technicians.

Palau Community College (PCC) would like to recognize and congratulate its alumnus, Mr. Six N. Rideb, who was recently accepted at the Florida Institute of Technology (FIT) under the Panther Fund Merit Scholarship. Mr. Rideb will be studying Business Admin-PCC Alumnus Mr. Six N. Rideb istration with an emphasis

on Leadership & Social Responsibility. The leadership and social responsibility degree program is designed for students who are interested in taking a leadership role in organizations and promote socially responsible behavior, high ethical standards, and a positive impact on their world.

Under the Panther Fund Merit Scholarship, Mr. Rideb will be awarded an annual amount of \$10,000 in support of his academic studies. The scholarship fund will be divided equally between the fall and spring semesters of a traditional academic year. Mr. Rideb will begin his attendance at the Florida Institute of Technology in the spring semester of next year (Spring 2017).

Mr. Rideb graduated from Palau Community College in May 2016 with an Associate of Science (AS) Degree in Business Administration. Students who participate in the Pacific STEP-UP Program are given the opportunity to conduct researches under the guidance of experienced researchers or mentors at local institutions supported by the program. The summer research internship spans a period of eight (8) weeks usually over the summer months. Each participant receives a participation allowance and may be eligible to travel to Washington, D. C. to present the results of their summer research at the National NIDDK STEP-UP Scientific Symposium which is held every year in August.

Students who are interested in participating in the Pacific STEP-UP Program must be third-year (junior) or fourth-year (senior) high school students at the time of the application. (S)he must also meet one of the following criteria: an underrepresented racial or ethnic group in biomedical research described by the National Science Foundation; disadvantaged as defined by annual family income; first generation in the family to attend college; or diagnosed with a disability limiting one or more major life activities.
