New officers of the 10th OEK House of Delegates are House of Delegates Speaker Sabino Anastacio, House of Delegates Vice Speaker Swenny Ongidobel, and House of Delegates Floor Leader Gibson Kanai. The event was held at the Capital Grounds in Ngerulmud, Melekeok on Thursday, January 19, 2017. Honored guests included ambassadors, international government officials, and members of the Diplomatic Corps. An Inaugural Ball was hosted later that evening. Mr. Vincent Lugert Visits PCC Campus

On Thursday, January 12, 2017 Aquaculture Research Scientist Vincent Lugert paid a courtesy visit to Palau Community College (PCC). He met with PCC President Dr. Patrick U. Tellei and PCC Cooperative Research & Extension (PCC-CRE) Vice President Thomas Taro to exchange information about aquaculture projects in the Pacific region.

Mr. Lugert previously worked as an Aquacultural Researcher under the Land Grant Program at the College of the Marshall Islands (CMI). His duties included directing the CMI Aquaculture Research Program,; hatchery of local marine species for local consumption, export, and restoration of wild stocks; developing methods & techniques for sustainable aquaculture in the Northern Pacific region; and technology transfer and consulting for local companies/farmers.

PEC Organizing Committee Meeting

Representatives from the Palau Ministry of Education (MOE) and Palau Community College (PCC) involved with organization of the 30th Pacific Educational Conference (PEC) met on Tuesday, January 17, 2017 at the PCC Assembly Hall. The committee members reviewed the necessary plans that are currently being made in anticipation of the educational conference. The 30th PEC is being hosted by Palau Community College and the Ministry of Education in collaboration with the Pacific Resources for Education and Learning (PREL). It is scheduled to take place in Palau from July 17, 2017 to July 30, 2017. The theme of is "Bedochel e Motekau el Kedul a Omesuub el Kirel a Klungiolir a Rengalek (quality & sustainability in education for student success)."

PCC CONTINUING EDUCATION (CE) NON-CREDIT COURSES OFFERED

The Palau Community College Continuing Education (CE) is offering non-credit courses this week in the area of art and design training:

INTRODUCTION TO FABRIC DESIGN

Upon completion of this training, the trainee will acquire skills & knowledge of the basic techniques for designing tablecloths, pillow covers, and clothes as well as hands-on experience with tie-dye, sponge-printing, and stenciling techniques (contact hours: 40).

INTRODUCTION TO DRAWING

Upon completion of this training, the trainee will acquire basic knowledge & skills in drawing and sketching. The trainee will also gain familiarity with tools & techniques used in drawing and the foundation of all other forms of art. The trainee will also learn the effective use of the line and how to create texture, shading, and depth as well as the use of pencil, charcoal, and pen & ink in drawing various subjects such as still-life, human figures, and landscapes (contact hours: 12).

INTRODUCTION TO WATERCOLOR PAINTING

Upon completion of this training, the trainee will understand the world of watercolor painting and gain familiarity by creating abstract designs, still-life, landscapes, and portraits. This training will cover color-mixing, watercolor techniques, the types of brushes & paper, and also explore the painting techniques of blending, overlaying, and dry & wet brush (contact hours: 12).

INTRODUCTION TO PRINT-MAKING

Upon completion of this training, the trainee will be familiar with the art of making prints or multiple copies of an image. A variety of printing techniques such as rubber-stamping, leaf-printing, sponge-printing, and linoleum block-printing will be covered. Prints will be made on paper in water-based inks (contact hours: 18).

INTRODUCTION TO OIL-PAINTING

Upon completion of this training, the trainee will have explored the basics of oil-painting, learn about the different tools as well as basic guidelines for creating oil-paintings, learn about the basic concepts of backgrounds, center, focus, and highlighting. During this course, each participant will create his/her own Rock Island Masterpiece (contact hours: 20).
