

Ecological Monitoring of Marine Protected Areas Training

On February 17, 2017 Palau Community College Continuing Educatwion and PICRC held a 1st Ecological Marine Protected Area Training at Palau International Coral Reef Center. Invited to participated in the training were Koror State Rangers employees. The training provided key fundamentals of ecological monitoring specific to State marine protected area needs using standardized protocol. Both theory and field practice were discussed to increase competency of participants to collect and assemble quality data. Participants also learned key objectives of ecological monitoring, sampling design to be used for ecological monitoring, ecological indicators to measure effectiveness of Marine Protected Areas, Survey Methods, Collection of Data, and Data Management (data entry, storage, and basic analysis) were all part of this training. Training participants were able to achieve both ecological monitoring theory competencies and field and data analysis compentencies. Minister F. Umiich Sengebau, Ministry of Natural Resources, Environment and Tourism was the guest speaker for the graduation. In his remarks, Minister Sengebaus emphasized the need for monitoring palau's MPA's as part of Marine Sanctuary Act.
