PCC CRE and Ngerdubech Corporation in Partnership to Culture Black Tiger Shrimp

To further Palau Government efforts in promoting economic and ecological sustainability and a healthy environment, the Palau Community College Cooperative Research and Extension headed by Vice President Thomas Taro and President of Ngerdubech Corporation, Mr. Shallum Etpison partnered to improve the aquaculture industry of Palau by now venturing into Black Tiger Shrimp (Penaeus monodon) locally known as "cherchur". This new aquaculture undertaking project was recommended by Ngerdubech Corporation representative after their visits to Southeast Asian Fisheries Development Center (SEAFDEC) aquaculture facilities for an educational tour in Iloilo, Philippines. The Black Tiger Shrimp project scheme partnership will have PCC CRE hatchery produce Black Tiger Shrimp fry locally to support this high value aquaculture species to marketable prize and transfer them to Ngatpang State fishponds. PCC CRE hatchery will monitor the shrimp spawning and broodstock management at Ngeremlengui Hatchery facility.

Currently, the female shrimp larval rearing is ongoing and recently had successfully released about 300,000 eggs in a 6 ton capacity tank. Last month using the same trial method of rearing shrimp, about 73% (200,000) species hatched into nauplii and were continually monitored until they reached post larvae stage that were ready for stocking in a grow-out pond. Since then, 80% of shrimp stock in nauplii have survived and reached the post larvae stage of 10 to 12 mm. A total of 150, 000 shrimp fry were harvested and stocked at Ngerdubech Corporation's fishpond at Ngatpang State last week. For future undertaking of this project, the locally bred Black Tiger Shrimp will be cultured in the pond for 4 months and is targeted for harvest in July 2107 given the proper environmental conditions. For continuous supply of seedstock and the success of this new project, all locals are encouraged to contact PCC CRE hatchery or Ngerdubech Corporation. This collaborative effort by PCC CRE, Ngerdubech Coroporation, and Ngatpang State Government in promoting locally produced Black Tiger Shrimp show that Palau has great potential to become self sustaining in supplying the couuntry's requirement of aquaculture commodity in the near future.
