On May 29, 2017 Palau Community College (PCC) held a New Student Orientation for the students enrolling in the summer session. The orientation introduced the new students to the programs and services available at the college. PCC President Dr. Patrick U. Tellei began the orientation by welcoming the new students. He thanked the students for choosing PCC as the next step in their education journey and advised the students to prioritize their education. Dean of Students Sherman Daniel followed with an introduction to the services available at the college designed to help the students achieve academic success.

PCC Director of Admissions & Financial Aid Dahlia M. Katosang also attended the orientation to provide the new students with information about the federal financial aid and its requirements. The new students were led on a tour of the college campus by members of the Associated Students of Palau Community College (ASPCC). The orientation also helped the new students begin their registration process. They met with the academic advisors from Student Life Division and planned their classes for the semester.

PCC & PNOC Signed MOU

On Friday, May 5, 2017, a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) agreement was signed between Palau Community College (PCC) and the Palau National Olympic Committee's (PNOC) Oceania Sports Education Program. With this collaborative efforts, PCC agreed to provide services to PNOC's OSEP program in course delivery and resources. These similar services may be extended to PCC staff and students, Ministry of Education's Physical Education teachers and various State Governments and their volunteers when the program is offered. PCC will be working closely with PNOC to advertise and promote the program and its courses, and hire qualified instructors. PNOC's personnel will coordinate adverstisement and schedule courses in addition to managing the OSEP Database for Palau participants and assist PCC of all costs incurred in providing OSEP courses.

2017 SDSU Bachelor Cohort Students

With much needed bachelor's degree credentials in the Republic of Palau. PCC and SDSU Administration, Rehabilitation, & Postsecondary Education Department has once again partnered to commence another bachelor's cohort. The bachelor's program is designed to allow working professionals to complete an advance degree without having to leave the island or their current position. The program is also designed to prepare Palau teachers and other interested individual from government offices, PCC, and other agencies with skills and expertise to provide high quality public services in their area.

Courses are designed to incorporate local context and cultural issues with a specific attention to learners diverse needs. Much of the instructions will be delivered through problem/project based learning techniques. Also using "real life" scenarios as the context of instruction, students will be better prepared to provide improved performance in their assigned duties and responsibilities.

Students are required to meet once a week with designated local learner facilitator. This group meetings allow for content discussions, teleconferences by the instructor, and for students to develop a deeper sense of being involved in a professional learning community that will have local impact. The bachelor's degree program utilizes a blended distance-learning model. This model will provide face to face instruction for most courses and is supported through local learning facilitators who work with a lead instructor to ensure courses are relevant to the learners' needs. Including in the delivery of instruction, courses are delivered via internet, use of portable flash drivesws, and various text materials. Instructors also interact with students via online discussions, web exercises, and audio lectures.

On June 02, 2017 Palau Community College bids farewell to its former Director and President of MOC/PCC, Mr. Wilhelm Rengesuul Rengiil. PCC Present Tellei delivered the PCC Board of Trustees Executive Directive to his daughter, Attorney General Ms. Ernestine Rengiil. The college Board of Trustees's Executive Directive recognizes Mr. Wilhelm R. Rengiil for his devotion to education in the Republic of Palau including Micronesian Occupational Center in 1972 and Micronesian Occupational College in 1987. Prior he assumed Ministerial position with Ministry of Natural Resources under the leadership of the late Ngiratkel Etpison, former President of the Republic of Palau. Mr. Rengiil's life-long teacher and mentor career began in 1948 as teacher at Palau Intermediate School and later became Principal of Palau Vocational School. Known for his leadership skills, Mr. Rengiil also held numerous key positions in national government, serving various community organizations, and holds two traditional leadership title of Melachelbeluu of Ngchemiangel in Aimeliik State and Tucherur of Iyebukel in Koror State. 
