UNITED STATES DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION (USDOE) FEDERAL UPDATES

Year-Round Pell Grants

Beginning with the 2017–2018 Award Year, a change to the Federal Pell Grant Program allows an eligible student to receive up to 150 percent of the student's Federal Pell Grant Scheduled Award which is equivalent to \$8,880. This means that a student could receive up to \$8,880 if he/she were to attend full-time during Fall, Spring and Summer terms.

To be eligible for the additional Pell Grant funds, the student must be otherwise eligible to receive Pell Grant funds for the payment period and must be enrolled at least half-time, in the payment period(s) for which the student receives the additional Pell Grant funds in excess of 100 percent of the student's Pell Grant Scheduled Award.

Note that the provisions of the new law state that any Pell Grant received will be included in determining the student's Pell Grant duration of eligibility and Lifetime Eligibility Used (LEU).

Federal Work-Study Program

Effective this Summer Term 2017, the Federal Work-Study Pay Rate will increase based on the federal minimum wage as follows:

- 1. Classification 1 \$7.25
- 2. Classification 2 \$7.50
- 3. Classification 3 \$7.75
- 4. Classification 4 \$8.00


All Federal Work-Study recipients will be paid according to the new rates starting July 1,2017 this Summer Term 2017.



The participants of the Care-Giving Program are taught by volunteer instructors who are certified nurses, physical therapists, and psychiatrists. The training session spans about two weeks in which a module is taught each week night. Each module covers a different aspect of caregiving such as proper way to prepare meals for a patient, personal hygiene, and different illnesses that may plague a patient. In addition, trained caregivers learn how to deal with the emotional and physical stresses of the occupation which is considered as one of the reason caregivers opt out.

PCC and Ministry of Health congratulate caregivers for completing the training and thank them for participating in this very worthy and humbled training to assist our elders and bedridden family members.
