Moments of 30th Pacific Educational Conference

The 30th Pacific Educational Conference (PEC) which seeks to find solutions and advances in raising student achievement and educators effectiveness took place on July $17 - 20\ 2017$ in Koror and was last hosted by the Republic of Palau in 2006.

The four-day event was held at Palau Community College and Palau High School. PEC is the largest gathering of the Pacific region's leaders, policymakers, teachers, students and stakeholders in education. The Ministry of Education and Palau Community College collaborated to host the conference along with Pacific Resources for Education and Learning.

The four-days event brought over 500 local and off-island participants with Pre-Conference sessions with topics ranging from Non-Communicable Disease to College Readiness. Conference Workshops included Assessment & Evaluation, Curriculum Standards, Early Childhood Education, Emerging Issues, Family and Community Engagement, Language and Bilingual Education, Project Based Learning, School Improvement, Special Ecducation, and Teaching Strategies. There were over hundred sessions offered during this four-days conference.

On Friday, July 21, 2017 the students who participated in the Summer Kids 2017 Program held a presentation at the Assembly Hall of the Koror State Government (KSG). The presentation was an opportunity for the students to showcase the cultural skills that they learned while participating in the summer program. Present to enjoy the performances were Koror State Governor Yoshitaka Adachi, PCC Dean of Continuing Education (CE) Willy Wally, Dr. Patrick U. Tellei, PCC President, Eyos Rudimch, Speaker - KSG Legislature, Josephine Ulengthong, Executive Director of WIOA, the summer culture class instructors, and the summer kids' parents. The presentation opened with welcoming remarks from Mr. Scott F. Yano, Director of KSG Dept. of State & Cultural Affairs. He acknowledged how teaching the young people of Palau about their culture and traditions was an important endeavor that should be supported by the entire community. Care-giving Training in Airai State

In collaboration with Ministry of Health, Palau Community College will once again offer Care-Giving Training to be held at Airai State Government's office from July 24, 2017 to July 28, 2017. The program aims to serve at least 15 interested individuals within *Airai State*. The main purpose of the training is to provide much needed basic caregiving training for individuals interested in caring for home-bound bedridden patients or loved ones including those of old age.

The training is divided into different modules, each will be taught a day from 6 p.m. to 8 p.m., Currently, there are ten (10) registered participants ready to begin the training. Participants will be taught about the different aspects of caring for bedridden patients such as physical care, personal hygiene, and food preparation. In addition, participants will learn how to deal with emotional and physical stresses that comes with the demands of care-giving. The following are the training topics to be offered and discussed including role playing: Normal Aging, General Principles in Caring for the Aged, Transfer & Fall Prevention, Pain and Symptom Management, Difficult Behaviors Activities of Daily Living Part I - Dressing, Grooming and Bathing, Oral Health Nutrition, Common Medical problems - bed sores, anemia, aspiration, constipation, and Dehydration, Relieving Care Giver and Family Stress, and Resources for Elderly.


