CTE Lab School To Commence

August 01, 2017 Palau Community College (PCC) held a meeting at PCC Assembly Hall for parents and students interested in CTE Lab School. The purpose of the program is to enroll 10 to 15 students who have completed their elementary education where they will complete and earn high school diploma and an associate of science degree at the end of four years of study. Academic Years' schedule, program curriculum, parent consent forms, program policies and applications were distributed to all parents to fill out and submit to PCC Administration Office. Present to promote and encourage parents to this new program was PCC President Patrick U. Tellei, Institutional Research and Evaluation Director Deikola Olikong, Dean of Academic Affairs, Robert Ramarui and Associate Dean of Academic Affairs, Marianne Temaungil. CTE Lab School is slated to commence at the end of August 2017.

Palau Community College is an accessible public educational institution helping to meet the technical, academic, cultural, social, and economic needs of students and communities by promoting learning opportunities and developing personal excellence.

In a collaborative effort with the Ministry of Health, Palau Community College continues to provide basic care-giving training program for interested individual. The participants of the caregiving Program are taught by volunteer instructors who are certified nurses, physical therapists, and psychiatrists. The training session spans about two weeks in which a module is taught each week night. Each module covers a different aspect of caregiving such as proper way to prepare meals for a patient, personal hygiene, and different illnesses that may plague a patient. In addition, trained caregivers learn how to deal with the emotional and physical stresses of the occupation which is considered as one of the reason caregivers opt out.

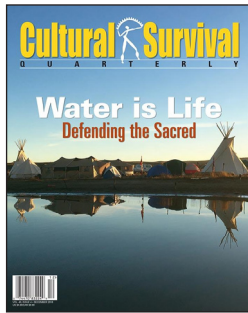
