Niigata University Visits PCC

On Friday, September 22, 2017 a group of fourteen (14) students from the Niigata College of Art & Design visited the campus of Palau Community College (PCC) to participate in an exchange with students from Palau. The students were accompanied by Niigata College of Art & Design President Kazuhito Kato and PCC Dean of Students Sherman Daniel. Kaipo Recheungel served as an interpreter for the students. The student exchange was held at the Palau Community College (PCC) Assembly Hall. After introductions, the students were given the opportunity to interact with one another through activities such as drawing, and learning how to make jewelry. Niigata College of Art & Design is located in Niigata-City, Japan. It provides various programs that focus on creative skills and production. Student exchanges between PCC students and students from Niigata College of Art & Design, which occurs on an annual basis, is an opportunity for the students to broaden their understanding of different cultures.

Europe donates to PCC

On Tuesday, September 26, 2017, His Excellency Jaroslav Olsa, Jr., Czech Republic Ambassador to the Republic of Palau, met with PCC Vice President for Administration & Finance Mr. Jay Olegeriil and Mr. Robert Ramarui, PCC Dean of Academic Affairs. Ambassador Olsa presented the College with a boxful of literary donations from the Czech Republic and the Federal Republic of Germany as part of the European Union's (EU) ongoing efforts to donate to the PCC Tan Siu Lin Library's International Collection. It is hoped that in the near future, there will be a sizeable collection to feature a section devoted to publications from Europe.

Ambassador Olsa is in Palau for the EU Film Festival co-hosted by the Republic of Palau and Palau Community College. He noted that this year's four featured films were carefully selected for Palau, and also noted that next year will mark the Festival's 10th anniversary and looked forward to it. VP Olegeriil assured Ambassador Olsa that PCC will continue its support for the Festival and looks forward to many more Festivals in the future as well.

Ambassador Olsa also presented print information on the Anglo-American University in Prague and encouraged PCC to pursue a possible student-exchange program with the university. He also mentioned the presence of the New York University in Prague as another U.S. degree granting institution in Prague, one that PCC might be interested in sending students to further their education, as Europe is closer to Palau compared to other nations.

The College thanked Ambassador Olsa for his visit and the book donations from Czech Republic and Germany, and for taking the time to visit PCC once again. On September 21, 2017, PCC President Dr. Patrick U. Tellei, Dean Robert Ramarui, Dean Jefferson Thomas, and Associate Dean Marianne Temaungil met with Civic Action Team to discuss the Emergency Medical Technical (EMT) Training in regards to RPPL 10-9. PresidentTellei briefed the CAT Officers about the purpose of the RPPL 10-9 including a background of early EMT training that was conducted in Palau. With a clear understanding of the needed training and the purpose of the law, CAT Officers agreed to work with Palau Community College, Ministry of Justice, and Ministry of Health to provide the needed EMT training. In addition, Academic Affairs and Continuing Education will be working with Chief Erik Dines, Apprenticeship AOIC, on possible credits and certificates for Administration Apprenticeship Program.


