

PCC Hosts Koror State Gubernatorial Forum

October 3, 2017 Palau Community College hosted the first Koror State Gubernationial Forum for the upcoming election slated for November 14, 2017. The seven candidates eveing for the Koror State leadership seat were former senator and minister Harry Fritz, Vice Speaker of Koror State Legislature Franco Gibbons, Speaker of Koror State Legislature Eyos Rudimch, former senator Roman Yano, former senator Alfonso Diaz, retired Aging Director Lillian Uludong and former senator Sam Yoyo Masang. All candidates participating in the three-hour forum were briefed on the purpose, rules, and format prior to the event at PCC Assembly Hall. PCC President Dr. Patrick U. Tellei was a moderator and a master of ceremony for the event. Each candidate was given time for opening statements, 4 questions from round 1 to 4, and closing statements. Also present were President of Associated Students of Palau Community College Zacateca Adelbai who read the Koror State preamble and PCC Board of Trusteees Chairman Masa-Aki Emesiochl who also thanked gubernatiorial candidates and students for their participation. The questions pulled for response by all candidates were taken from the following topics: Youth/Senior Citizens, Economy & Budget, Lease/Displaced homeowners, Infrastructure, Environment, and Relationship with House of Traditional Leaders.

SC 103 at CRRF Presentation at PCC Assembly Hall

On October 4, 2017 the Coral Reef Research Foundation had a presentation at the Palau Community College Assembly Hall from 9 am to 11 am. Industry employee Madelsar Ngiraingas facilitated the presentation with the Coral Reef Research Foundation about The Environmental Affects on the Jellyfish Lake with co-presenter Gerda Ucharm.

The presentation discussed the effects of weather and mother nature and how it contirbutes to the diminishing number of jellyfish in the lake. Research also indicated the growth of the jellyfish in favorable and unfavorable conditions and what they are doing to revitalize the negative effects on the growth of the jellyfish. The second part of the presentation discussed number of visitors to the jellyfish lake and how it impact the jellyfish and its environment. At the end, a group discussion focused on ways to help mitigate jellyfish lake and recommendations for State and National Government on how to support and implement sustainable plans to save the jellyfish lake.


