Katosang, Admissions Counselor Mekreos Silil and Financial Aid Counselor Lakolani Olngellel were busy with recruitment at the local high schools during the day and holding financial aid night sessions in the evenings for high school seniors and their parents.

Topics discussed during the Recruitment meetings included college's academic programs and services, and the admissions requirements. Admissions Application Forms were distributed to interested seniors to complete with the assistance of the college personnel. The topics discussed during financial aid night sessions with the seniors and their parents included information about Federal Student Aid Programs, eligibility requirements and forms were distributed to interested students to complete with assistance of college personnel.

By meeting high schools in smaller groups, the college was able to reach 191(77%) of the 248 seniors including PCC Adult High School students for recruitment and 135 (54%) for the financial aid night sessions. As part of the recruitment activities, we will continue to contact students who were not able to attend sessions and provide information and assistance to them to attend PCC. For the month of March 2013, we will continue to conducted financial aid sessions with our continuing students to discussed new federal updates and complete financial aid forms including 2013-2014 Free Application for Federal Student Aid.
