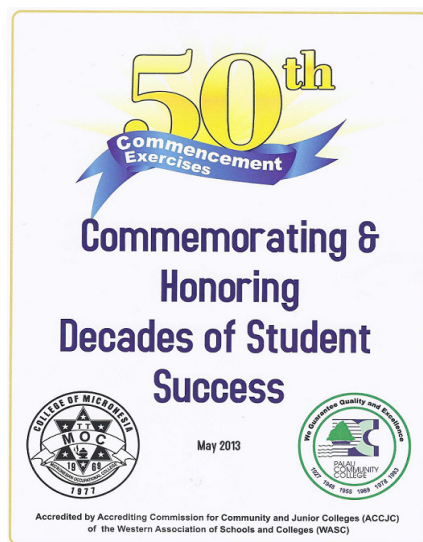

50th PCC Commencement Exercises!

Today, Palau Community College (PCC) celebrates its 50th Commencement Exercises! A total of 129 students will be receiving their degrees and certificates: 100 PCC graduates including summer candidates, 7 PCC & MOH Substance Abuse and Addiction Treatment Counseling Program graduates, and 22 Adult High School graduates.



The Honorable Billy G. Kuartei, a member of the PCC Board of Trustees, will deliver the commencement address. Pastor Hiob Ngirachemoi of Palau Evangelical Church will be giving the invocation and benediction.

In addition to PCC President, Dr. Patrick U. Tellei, and PCC Dean of Academic Affairs, Tutii Chilton, officiators of the ceremony include Ibedul Yutaka M. Gibbons, Reklai Raphael B. Ngirmang, Masa-Aki N. Emesiochl (Vice-Chairperson of PCC Board of Trustees), Summer R. Saunders (Student Trustee of PCC

Board of Trustees), Peleliu State Governor Temmy Shmull, and Dr. Emais Roberts (PCC Board of Trustees).

Director of the Bureau of Education Administration, Emery Wenty, will be awarding the Adult High School diplomas. The Minister of Health, Gregorio Ngirmang, will be awarding certificates to the graduates of the Substance Abuse and Addiction Treatment Counseling Program.

A BRIEF HISTORY: MOC/PCC

Palau Community College (PCC) began in 1969 as a two-year post secondary vocational/technical institution called Micronesian Occupational Center (MOC). It grew out of a trade school that had been established in 1927 during the Japanese administration.

In May 1978, Micronesian Occupational Center officially became Micronesian Occupational College; then on April 2, 1993 it became Palau Community College after President Kuniwo Nakamura signed the Higher Education Act of 1993.

Today's 50th Commencement Exercises marks the graduation of over 4,000 students from PCC.
