Coral Reef Research Foundation Enlightens SC 239 Class

On Tuesday, November 21, 2017, SC239 Natural History of Palau (hybrid) class gained firsthand, invaluable knowledge about Palau's marine lakes and the five subspecies of the Golden Mastigias in Palau from Ms. Sharon Patris, a member of the scientific research team from Coral Reef Research Foundation (CRRF). CRRF is the leading agency for research and monitoring of various parameters of the marine lakes in Koror since 1998. This presentation was part of CRRF's school outreach program, supported by Global Environment Facility-Small Grant Programme (GEF-SGP). Sharon Patris' presentation was coherent, educational, and impactful. The students commented that, not only did they learn new and very interesting information about marine lakes in Palau, but also the presentation by Sharon Patris made them aware of the distinctiveness of Palau's marine lakes. The number and diversity of marine lakes and the strange and unusual life forms that inhabit the marine lakes captivated the students' interests in science. Many of them, even non-science majors, were moved by their newly acquired knowledge and the research being conducted that they professed interest in internship positions at CRRF.


