PCC CRE Provides Rabbitfish to Local Farm

More than 2,000 hatchery produced rabbitfish (Siganuslineatus) juveniles from Palau Community College (PCC) Multispecies Hatchery located at Ngermetengel, Ngeremlegui State were delivered to a newly established Aquapro Fish Farm in Koror State on January 11, 2018. This farm is operated by a partnership of three local fishermen; Tmerukl Shmull, Jay Okada and Godwin Ito, all residents of Koror State. The release of these fingerlings is an offshoot of the recently concluded Palau Aquaculture Workshop that was held at PCC last September 27 - 29, 2017, which created a partnership between the Bureau of Marine Resources (BMR), The Nature Conservancy (TNC) and PCC to promote community livelihood and food security through aquaculture development in the country. Among species that were identified for commercial production, the rabbitfish ranks second in priority. Rabbitfish continued on page 2

Currently, the country's Aquaculture Working Group is aiming to establish at least 20 pilot farms all over Palau in 2018. Research on the refinement of the seed production technique for the two species of rabbitfish, "kelsebuul" (S. lineatus) and "meas" (S.fuscescens), has been undertaken and demonstrated at PCC hatchery with the funding support coming from USDA-NIFA through the College of Micronesia Land Grant Program (COM-Land Grant) and Center for Tropical and Subtropical Aquaculture (CTSA). Aside from providing free rabbitfish juveniles to the fish farmers, PCC-CRE also provides technical assistance by giving advice on proper husbandry, feeding management and monitoring of environmental parameters in
