SDSU Course DLE 515 with Sera Hernandez



The SDSU Multilingual Education Theory & Practice: Second Language Learners in Emerging Nation and Community (DLE 515) course is designed to provide participants with a foundational understanding of multilingualism, multilingual education, and second language learning for diverse communities. The course will cover sociohistorical and theoretical foundations of bilingual education and issues of equality and educational opportunity for language learners, and apply them to the sociocultural and political context surrounding language learning in Palau. The course' program learning objectives

are as follows: engaging and supporting students in learning, planning instruction and designing learning experiences for all students, creating and maintaining effective environments for student learning, developing as a professional educator, and subject matter preparation - language, linguistics, and literacy. Upon completing the course students will be able to describe the sociolinguistic and cultural context of Palauan schools and communities, gain a global perspective on multilingualism and society, apply the foundations of bilingual education theory, methods, and practice for local ethnolinguistic groups that promote bilingualism, biliteracy, and biculturalism.
