The focus of the workshop was to have Palau project members from Ministry of Natural Resources, Environment, and Tourism (MNRET), Environmental Quality Protection Board (EQPB), and Palau Community College share progress of activities, exchange ideas to improve activities and update action plans of current watershed in Babeldaob. JIRCAS project leader Dr. Takeshi Watanabe welcomed and introduced all workshop presenters from JIRCAS.
