Palau Community College (PCC) held its New Student Orientation for the 2019 Spring Semester on Monday, January 07, 2019. All new students registered for the upcoming semester were required to attend the orientation. The orientation was an opportunity to introduce new students to the academic programs and support services available at the college as well as assisting the new students with completing the necessary documents for enrollment. Dean of Students Sherman Daniel introduced student services available at the college and encouraged the students to take advantage of the resources available at the Learning Resource Center (LRC), such as peer tutoring, and to keep an open communication with their counselors at the Student Life Unit.
