The purpse of the workshop was to provide information to ETS participants on college admissions application and requirements, Palau National Scholarship financial assistance such as scholarships and loans including Non-PNSB sponsored scholarships and personal budgeting and finance information provided by Palau Small Business Development Center.

PCC ETS program has been very active in providing needed services to students in both elementary and high schools in Palau. The program is federally funded on a five year cycle by the U.S. Department of Education and serves first generation, low income and disabled students including PCC Adult High School students.  - a. Example: E-Van Ongrung.....e-vano
 - b. Example: Mary Jane Goodman.....maryjaneg
 - c. Example: O.J. Woodward.....ojw
- 2. Your password is your student ID number and it can be found on your PCC student ID card.
 - NOTE: Social Security number is not a password so if your ID number on your student ID card is your SS number then please kindly stop by at Registrars Office and request for your correct student ID number.
