The main purpose of the drill is to have all staff and students move to designated safe areas of the college away from imminent threat to the lives or property of the college such as fire, hazardous materials, or contamination. With the assistance from the 26th Law Enforcement Academy cadets and the college Emergency Preparedness Task Force members, the college evacuation drill was carried out effectively. According to PCC Emergency Preparedness Task Force chairman, there will be another evacuation drill to be conducted on campus which will be unannounced. PCC thanks all staff and students who participated in the evacuation drill and reminded everone to read their Emergency Operation Plan.

 - b. Example: Mary Jane Goodman......maryjancg
 - c. Example: O.J. Woodward.....ojw
- 2. Your password is your student ID number and it can be found on your PCC student ID card.
 - a. NOTE: Social Security number is not a password so if your ID number on your student ID card is your SS number then please kindly stop by at Registrars Office and request for your correct student ID number.
